Seminar: Inequality – How do we measure it, what do we know, and what does it imply? (6 ECTS)

Description

Inequality is one of the most pressing problems of our time. It is deeply rooted in society. Inequality is both, the consequence of social dynamics and at the same time affecting further developments. Because of its relevance, the discussion on inequality is often fiercely contested and shaped by political backgrounds. This seminar aims at objectifying the debate.

Seminar participants will work on current topics in the field of inequality research. The seminar covers 1) the definitions of inequality and the different forms it takes, 2) their implications and, 3) different approaches of tackling inequality. Both experimental and empirical approaches are covered. The skills acquired in the seminar will be useful for writing a master thesis. The goals of the seminar are to:

- Acquire, select and discuss relevant and current scientific literature on the topic and background.
- Produce and present a scientific seminar paper and discuss peers' drafts and final papers.

Who can participate?

The seminar is aimed at Master students (M. Sc. VWL / Economics (internal for all tracks) / BWL) and conducted in English. We expect participants to actively contribute to the seminar, be it during the semester or during the discussion of the presentations at the block seminar.
